What is this product?

Type: Mutual Fund (hereafter «M/F») of Law 4099/2012

Term: The Fund has a predetermined maturity and will be fully liquidated by 29.03.2030. The Fund's dissolution may occur in case any of the conditions referred to in article 9 par. 1 of L.4099/2012 are met in accordance with the article 11 of the Fund's Regulation. The redemption of the MF's units is mandatory when requested by the unitholder.

Objective: The Fund aims to achieve a return, based on its investment policy, derived from both income and capital appreciation, mainly through investments in a diversified portfolio of Euro-denominated bonds. To achieve its objective, the Fund invests at least 65% of its net asset value in bonds, on average quarterly. In addition, the Fund may invest in deposits, money market instruments, other securities, UCITS and other undertakings for collective investment.

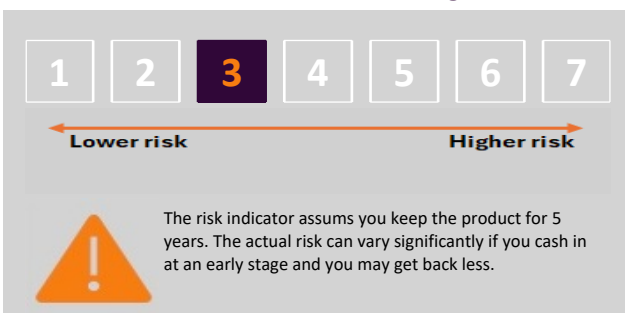
The Fund does not intend to invest in equities. The Fund's investments may begin at the end of the subscription period. In more detail, the Fund intends to invest mainly in a portfolio of government and corporate bonds listed either in the domestic market or in regulated markets abroad. Additionally, the Fund aims to make the best possible use of its cash by investing it in interest-bearing investments in the form of fixed-term deposits and other related money market instruments. The Fund's investment strategy is based on holding bonds until their maturity. At the end of the subscription period, the portfolio's weighted average maturity will be close to 5 years. In the event that the bonds mature before the maturity date of the Fund, they will be replaced either with other bonds with a maturity close to the remaining time duration of the Fund or with money market instruments. All of the Fund's assets will be liquidated by 29.03.2030. In the context of effective management and/or hedging the portfolio's assets, the Fund may take long or short positions on bonds derivatives. The Fund has no Benchmark. The Fund is actively managed.

Intended retail investor type: The Fund mainly targets investors with a 5 year horizon seeking income through a diversified bond portfolio consisting mainly of Euro-denominated bonds, willing to accept a equivalent level of investment risk.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



Risk indicator

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the risk level of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have ranked the Fund as 3 out of 7, which rates the potential losses from future performances at a medium-low level, and adverse market conditions are unlikely to impact the Fund's ability to pay you.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

If the Fund cannot pay you what is owed, you could potentially lose your entire investment.

Besides the market risk, the derivatives risk and the interest rate risk, risks that are substantially related to the Fund and are not taken into consideration by the risk indicator, are the following:

- **Liquidity Risk:** May arise from unfavourable market conditions and affects the Fund's ability to sell assets. The investor may receive an amount smaller than the calculated fair value when making a liquidation decision due to a possible reduction in the price of the unit in the interim, while he may not be able to redeem the units of the desired time. Also, under extreme liquidity conditions the net price of the unit may decrease significantly.
- **Credit Risk:** May arise from the possibility of a bond issuer's default.
- **Inflation Risk:** May arise from the inflationary trends that occur in the economy.
- **Counterparty Risk:** The risk of failing to settle a transaction on financial instruments due to the counterparty's non-payment or inability to deliver securities on time.
- **Risk spreading:** May arise from the limited dispersion of assets. This risk is reduced by the limits set for investing in the same issuer. With these limits, a greater dispersion is being achieved.
- **Risk of asset reduction:** May arise from the reduction of the Fund's assets due to the redemption of its units.
- **Operational Risk:** It is related to human errors, inadequate processes and weaknesses in the company's systems, or external factors.
- **Custodian Risk:** The risk of losing assets due to acts or omissions by the Custodian or even due to fraud in case the Custodian or any third party who has been entrusted with custody of the Fund's assets proves to be insolvent.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Performance scenarios

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. The unfavourable, moderate, and favourable scenarios shown are illustrations using the worst, average, and best performance of the product over the last 10 years. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

Recommended holding period: 5 years

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back. The stress scenario shows what you could lose at extreme market conditions. The unfavourable scenario occurred for an investment between October 2021 - October 2022 (if you redeem after 1 year) and between October 2017 - October 2022 (if you redeem after 5 years). The moderate scenario occurred for an investment between November 2020 - November 2021 (if you redeem after 1 year) and between March 2017 - March 2022 (if you redeem after 5 years). The favourable scenario occurred for an investment between March 2020 - March 2021 (if you redeem after 1 year) and between February 2016 - February 2021 (if you redeem after 5 years). This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period you may have to pay extra costs.

What happens if the fund is unable to payout?

The investor may face a financial loss (equal to a part or the entire investment) in the event of default of the Mutual Fund. Such a potential loss is not covered by any guarantee fund. In this context, there is a potential default risk if the assets of the Mutual Fund held by the Custodian are lost. The Custodian is liable to the Mutual Fund or to the investors of the Mutual Fund in the event of loss by the Custodian or one of its representatives of the financial products held by the Custodian, unless the Custodian can prove that the loss has arisen because of an external event beyond its reasonable control and the consequences would be unavoidable despite its reasonable efforts to the contrary. In all other cases, the Custodian is liable in the event of its negligent or intentional failure to properly fulfill its obligations pursuant to L. 4099/2012 and the UCITS Directive 2009/65/EU as well as any applicable legislative and regulatory framework governing Mutual Funds.

What are the costs?

Cost over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual term). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- 10.000 EUR is invested.

(*) This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example, it shows that if you exit at recommended holding period, your average return per year is projected to be 4.1% before costs and 2.3% after costs.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

The minimum recommended holding period, given the Mutual Fund's investments nature and its objective for a return achievement, is 5 years. In most cases, added value will be generated over a medium to long term period.

Investors may request daily (working days in Greece) the redemption of their units before the recommended holding period. In this case, the rules of the Company's applicable pricing policy are applied.
